Nearly 500 students from GHS traveled by bus to area businesses on October 16 to learn about careers in manufacturing, health care, education, marketing and more during the first annual "Career Exploration Day." 14 area business participated in the program.

The new program, made possible thanks to a \$3,000 AT&T Wisconsin Innovation & Investment Award, is a collaboration of the Grafton Education Foundation (GEF) and the Grafton Area Chamber of Commerce. The goal is to connect students with local businesses to provide them with experiences and information as they think about their career and education plans.

The Grafton Education Foundation was organized by a small group of citizens convinced that if Grafton students are to succeed in the classroom, additional funding must be raised to support their education. The

GEF has realized remarkable growth since its incorporation. Over \$64,000 has been distributed to the Grafton School District by the Foundation over the years – \$61,000 to fund grants to classroom teachers and \$3,000 to fund GHS's recent Career Exploration Day.



Many citizens have joined our effort to fuel the growth of the GEF. But additional staff is needed to help with the many committees that organize our five major fund raisers. 2013 Inductees to the Grafton High School Hall of Fame



Dr. John Burfeind graduated in 1985 as class valedictorian with a 4.0 grade point average. He participated in athletics, experiencing success in football, basketball and track. He was a starter on the varsity football team, playing on teams that twice went to the state championship. He was named to the All-State football team in 1984 and garnered the WIAA Scholar Athlete Award in 1985. He graduated from the University of Wisconsin Medical School in 1993. After completing an internship at Abbott-Northwestern Hospital in Minneapolis, he completed a residency in internal medicine and a fellowship in hematology/oncology, both at the Medical College of Wisconsin. He was named Best Teaching Fellow in

1998 at the Medical College of Wisconsin. Upon graduation, he practiced hematology and medical oncology in Oregon and was named Best Teaching Faculty in 2002. He returned to the Milwaukee area in 2003 and for 7 years practiced at St. Mary's Ozaukee, developing the Columbia-St. Mary's oncology program by serving as the Chairman of the Cancer Committee and running the Tumor Board. Presently, he is an Assistant Professor of Medicine at the Medical College of Wisconsin, specializing in genitourinary oncology.

Mr. Gene Schmit, a 1953 GHS graduate, played basketball, baseball and 6-man football and was a member of the drama and discussion clubs. Following graduation, he and his father established a local realty and

auctioneering business now known as Gene W. Schmit, Realtor and Auctioneer. Gene is an active member of the Grafton Lions Club, St. Joseph's parish, Rose-Harms American Legion and the Grafton Chamber of Commerce. He truly cares about Grafton and gives his time and financial support whenever possible. He is the recipient of numerous honors including both Grafton and Port Washington Citizen of the Year; the Lions International Foundation's Melvin Jones Fellowship and Birch-Sturm Fellowship awards; and the Port Washington Humanitarian Award. He was recognized for his service on the Town of Grafton Plan Commission in 2001 and was named Business Person of the Year in 2004. In 2008, he was inducted into the Wisconsin Auctioneer Hall of Fame, and in 2011 he was inducted to the Wisconsin Polka Hall



of Fame. Gene takes pride in the accomplishments of his family, is dedicated to his church and community, and helps to keep. Grafton a wonderful place to raise children. He shies away from recognition, giving the Grafton community the credit for providing the foundation for his humble generosity.

Mr. Gregory Thome, a 1984 GHS graduate, is a diplomat who has worked overseas for most of the past 25 years to defend American national interests and to protect the rights of American citizens abroad. At the time of induction, Greg was the Deputy Chief of Mission at the U.S. Embassy in Cameroon, responsible for coordinating all Embassy operations. At GHS, Greg was a member of the National Honor Society and won six athletic letters in cross country and track. He also represented Grafton at Badger Boy State. After graduating from UW-Madison in 1988 Greg joined the Peace Corps and in 1991, he joined the U.S. Department of State in



Washington. President George H.W. Bush signed his commission as a Foreign Service Officer in 1992. Since then, he has served overseas at U.S. Embassies on five continents. In 2008, he volunteered for duty at the U.S. Embassy in Baghdad, Iraq, serving on a large team that, as part of the "Surge" policy, coordinated the transfer of American economic and development assistance activities from U.S. military personnel to U.S. government civilian agencies. Greg has also served in various capacities at U.S. diplomatic posts in Finland; Guyana; Brazil; and Gabon. He worked at the State Department in Washington for six years as well. Greg speaks Portuguese, French, Spanish, Bissau-Guinean Creole and Finnish.

The GHS Hall of Fame was initiated in 2010 and now has 10 distinguished inductees. The Hall of Fame was established to recognize the outstanding lifetime achievements of GHS graduates and to provide inspirational role models for the current students and members of the community.
